

Speaker for Monday - January 28, 2013: Brian Haggerty - "Positive Youth Initiative"



Brian Haggerty is a member of the El Paso Community College Board of Trustees. He was also elected Justice of the Peace. Mr. Haggerty has a long record of public service in El Paso. He was appointed to the EPCC Board of Trustees in 1995 and was later elected to the position in 1966. Since then, he has continued to serve the college as a board member. In 2010, Mr. Haggerty was appointed to serve as Justice of the Peace and was elected as a judge

last November 2010. Mr. Haggerty also has extensive experience in the real estate business. As a Board member Mr. Haggerty is strongly committed to improving education and student living conditions, and as Justice of the Peace, he will dedicate himself to serving the people that visit his court. He is also continuously seeking new programs and ideas to help re-direct and challenge young people who are disoriented and often disenfranchised from their families. 

Special Thanks to "Rotarian" Laura Smart for sharing her *polio vaccination adventure* in India with us last week.



Laura Smart

Since the <u>PolioPlus</u> program's inception in 1985, more than two billion children have received oral polio vaccine. But Rotary's work is not done: The disease has not yet been eradicated. <u>Contribute to the PolioPlus Fund online</u> or by <u>mail</u> to support Rotary's goal of a polio-free world. More is needed to end polio. <u>Donate now to help Rotary achieve a polio-free world</u>.

What polio eradication costs - Upwards of US\$1 billion per year from all sources is needed in donor contributions to fund the final eradication phase. (Visit polioeradication.org for the most updated figures.) This level of expense is expected to decrease as wild poliovirus transmission is interrupted in the remaining polio-endemic countries and outbreaks in previously polio-free countries are reduced. The budget for the Global Polio Eradication Initiative is revised quarterly to reflect changes in epidemiology as well as financial contributions made by Rotary and other donors to the program.



President's Message (Rotary – Be Aware!)

"AWARE" means having knowledge of or being cognizant of --- it implies knowledge gained through one's own perceptions or by means of information. Have you told anyone about Rotary recently? Have you shared some of your Rotary knowledge and experience with a friend, neighbor, business colleague or family member? What did you say? Did you tell them that Rotary International is a volunteer organization of business and professional leaders who provide humanitarian service, and help to build goodwill and peace in the world, and that there are approximately 1.2 million Rotary club members belonging to 34,000 Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Do they know that Rotary clubs exist to improve communities through a range of humanitarian, intercultural and educational activities and that clubs advance international understanding by partnering with clubs in other countries? Are they aware that Rotary also encourages high ethical standards in all vocations, and addresses critical issues at home and abroad by providing health care and medical supplies, clean water, food, job training, youth development, and education to millions of people in need? Do they realize that Rotary is the volunteer arm of a global partnership dedicated to eradicating polio and that Rotary volunteers assist in vaccine delivery, social mobilization and logistical help in cooperation with the national health ministries, the World Health Organization (WHO), UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention? Have they been told that in an effort to educate tomorrow's peacemakers and ambassadors, up to 110 Rotary World Peace Fellows are sponsored each year to study at one of the eight universities for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution and that since 2002, 431 fellows from over 75 countries have participated at a cost of more than \$23 million? Would they be shocked to know that Rotary is the world's largest privately-funded source of international scholarships, and that each year, about 1,000 university students receive Rotary scholarships to study abroad and that Rotary clubs coordinate a high school-age student exchange program that has sent nearly 8,000 students abroad for three months to a year? Have they been made cognizant of the fact that Rotary clubs initiate thousands of humanitarian service projects every year and that these volunteer-driven projects address the root causes of conflict, such as hunger, poverty, disease and illiteracy and that Rotary clubs work to improve literacy rates worldwide? What else? - Oh Yeah - Did I say its FUN!!

Our team will be hosted in the Province of Manitoba and the western portion of Ontario. This means that you would arrange flights to and from Winnipeg, flying in on May 22 and out on June 6. 
